

SPECIFIC COVID-19 PANDEMIC PREVENTION AND CONTROL MEASURES FOR PEOPLE ENTERING VIETNAM

On 16 December 2021, The Ministry of Health has issued a document on the prevention of the COVID–19 epidemic for people on entry, effective from 1 January 2022




General pandemic prevention and control requirements for people on entry

- Having negative test results for SARS-CoV-2 before entry (except for children under 2 years old)
- Make medical declaration before entry
- In case the entry is a Vietnamese citizen, overseas Vietnamese and relatives (including spouse, children) who have not been vaccinated or have not received enough doses of COVID-19 vaccine, vaccination will be performed (**free injection**) during the quarantine period (**if eligible**)
- Paying for testing costs, medical isolation, examination and treatment costs and other related expenses (if any) in the prevention and control of the Covid–19 pandemic as prescribed in **Resolution No. 16/NQ–CP**
 - Requirements for those who have had a full dose of vaccine or have recovered from COVID-19



- In the first **3 days** from the entry date: the person on entry will self-monitor their health at the place of stay, not be allowed to meet people around or to leave the accommodation
- SARS-CoV-2 test by RT-PCR method will be done on the 3rd day from the entry date. If the test result is negative, they will continue to monitor health until the end of 14 days from the date of entry. If the test result is positive, it will be handled according to regulations



Requirements for those who have not been vaccinated or have received insufficient doses of COVID-19 vaccine

- Isolation at the place of residence for **07 days** from the entry date
- Test for SARS-CoV-2 by RT-PCR method on the 3rd and 7th day. If the test result is negative, they will continue to monitor health until the end of 14 days. If the test result is positive, it will be handled according to regulations

Requirements for people under 18 years of age, aged 65 years or older, pregnant women, and people with underlying medical conditions



- Isolated with parents/cares (hereinafter referred to as caregivers)
- The caregiver must have received the **full dose** of COVID-19 vaccine or **recovered** from COVID-19 and must sign a commitment to voluntarily self-isolate after being explained about the risks of infection; must strictly comply with the requirements on testing and regulations on COVID-19 prevention and control like those on entry
